AUW Fall Retreat with keynote speaker Ann Reed



An update on AUW's Relationship with 1st Universalist

Last spring we started asking questions about the relationship of AUW to the church and whether AUW should become an official program of the church or remain, as it has for 100 years, an independent women's group strongly affiliated with First Universalist. Issues were raised about AUW's status as a non-profit entity, its tax status and issues of liability for board members since these were the main benefits we could see from joining officially as a church program. If these could be resolved there was no strong reason to give up our independence. At the annual meeting it was agreed that more information was needed. Since the annual meeting the following has happened.

AUW has been renewed as a non-profit. AUW was first organized as a non-profit about 100 years ago. However, that status was dissolved in about 1998. We have learned that in about 1992 the law changed and required all non-profits to reregister annually. Those that failed to do so after a short period of time were dissolved. Obviously AUW was unaware of this legal change back in the 90's and had not made the annual registrations. Happily it was easy to reregister now and AUW was reactivated retroactively.

There is information regarding our tax status. AUW spoke to an attorney that does non-profit work. Being a non-profit does not give an organization tax free status. Technically AUW should have filed tax returns for the last 100 years. But as a practical matter we have no income since our expenses almost always offset our income. So failure to file in the past is not really a problem. We could consider getting some type of exemption from filing tax returns. The easiest is to self-declare as a 504(c)(4) organization. These are not charitable organizations but ones that work for community benefit. Such organizations do not have to pay income taxes and can file a 990N postcard every year. To get this status we need to restate our articles to fit within IRS standards. The lawyer can help us do this for a modest fee. To become a 503(b) (3) which allows us to avoid paying sales tax and to have people donate to AUW tax free is difficult. This process requires an application and proof that we are truly religious or charitable. It's not clear that AUW would qualify for this or that it is worth the effort. We are going forward with the small change needed to become a 503(c)(4) so we do not have to file annual tax returns.

Information on Board Liability-Minnesota law provides that AUW must indemnify any board member who might be sued. This does provide some protection.

However, because the assets of AUW are modest the board has decided to explore the exact cost of officer and director liability insurance which should be less than \$1000 a year.

More information will be available at the fall kick-off.

A History of Our Own

Biography of Mary Garard Andrews (1853-1936) (8)

AUW activist Mary Garard Andrews was an important local and national figure in "Woman suffrage," the temperance movement, the Universalist denomination, and as one of the first women ministers in the United States.

Mary was highly independent and mobile for a woman of her time; she was born in West Virginia in 1853. She supported herself after being orphaned at age twelve, attended two of the first colleges to admit women in Michigan and Illinoisone while she held her first ministerial job at the Free Will Baptist Church in Hillsdale, Michigan. Mary soon converted to Universalism and was ordained as a Universalist minister in 1881; she served Universalist churches in Nebraska, Iowa, and Illinois. Mary Garard continued working part-time after marrying Isaac R. Andrews, a lawyer from Omaha, in 1888. In 1911, six years after her husband's death, Mary and her son, Rollin, settled in Minneapolis in order to live near a strong Universalist Church. Active in women's clubs wherever she lived, Mary was a devoted temperance worker, president of the Nebraska Suffrage Association, a national officer of the National Suffrage Association, national chaplain of the Woman's Relief Corps of America, and a Grand Army worker. In Minneapolis, Mary joined Church of the Redeemer (predecessor to First Universalist) and became active in Redeemer's women's group and the statewide Women's Missionary Association. She also joined the Equal Suffrage Association, the Political Equality Club, the Lewis Parliamentary Law Association, the Columbian Club, the Minneapolis Society of Fine Arts, Women's Co-operative Alliance, and the Business and Professional Women's Club.

Mary Garard Andrews died in her Minneapolis home in 1936, sixteen years after woman suffrage was achieved. This pioneering woman minister is fondly remembered for these inspiring words: "I never spent much time over the oft controversial question, 'Shall women preach?' I thought the most satisfactory solution of the problem would be for each woman quietly, without ostentation or controversy, to assume her place and let her work speak for itself". (9)

We are beginning our fifth year of knitting hats and scarves for the homeless people in our community. I have been pleasantly surprised at the number of hats that have been dropped off at the church over the summer. The big push comes in November and December when winter is approaching and hats and scarves are delivered to area shelters. However, we have an event on October 28th for homeless teens, and we will need about 100 hats to have on hand (some for babies too). It is time to get out the knitting needles and yarn and start knitting. Last year we collected close to 1600 hats! Please share what we are doing and tell all your knitting friends about the project too.

We are now knitting with a group of women at Vale Place. We are no longer knitting at Ascension Place. Several of the women in our new group knit, but a few need help transitioning from knitting scarves on straight needles to working on circulars for hats. Over the summer, we have been meeting on the last Tuesday of the month at 3:00 pm. However, the day and time is flexible if you are interested in knitting with us. Vale Place is on 36th at Hennepin. It is a program for people experiencing mental health issues. Yarn donations are also needed for Vale Place.




