AUW/MUUSJA Voting Rights Campaign Report

The Voting Rights team is building on the Action of Immediate Witness (AIW) they helped pass at the UUA General Assembly (GA) in Salt Lake City last June. Our goal is to pass federal legislation requiring every state to use secure paper ballots and manual audits as Minnesota does. The primary bill by Rep. Holt of New Jersey has been stalled due to healthcare reform but we hope the upcoming 2010 elections will get it moving soon.

We are pleased that our program for the 2010 UUA General Assembly (GA), titled Honoring the Inherent Worth of Voters for 36 Years, was accepted. It will focus on how Minnesota has used election-day voter registration since 1974 to achieve the nation's highest voter turnout with short waits, minimal voter suppression and no voter fraud. MN Secretary of State Mark Ritchie and senior election official Carol Johnson will be the featured speakers,





deaths of significant people, big birthdays and both serious and silly times together. We choose a topic each month for discussion the following month. It is great to have a monthly opportunity to catch up on the lives of four very interesting women. But the intention to explore our personal spiritual journey with other women also engaged in a spiritual quest makes this group special and different from other casual get-togethers with friends.
